1. Welcome to Our Apartment

Enjoy a stay in a modern apartment in the very center of Prague. The apartment is located in a newly built building in a quiet courtyard of a historic house where the composer Antonín Dvořák once lived.

Just 1 minute walk from Karlovo Náměstí, with tram and metro stops within walking distance, it's an ideal base for exploring the city. The street offers shops, cafés, bars, and traditional Czech pubs, while the apartment itself remains calm and peaceful.

2. Access to the Property

To access the property, you will need two PINs. We will share them with you before your arrival.

From the street, enter through the gate using a 4-digit PIN. Press the key symbol  before entering the PIN and press the key symbol  again after the PIN.

Example: XXXX



Walk through the yard; at the end you'll find **Flat 117**. To enter the building, use the second PIN. The apartment door has no handle—after entering the PIN, you'll hear it unlock, then simply push the door to open it.



From inside the apartment, **press the center of the knob** to lock or unlock the door. When leaving the property, you can also **lock the door using the chevron symbol ◀** on the keypad.



3. House Rules

To make sure everyone has a pleasant and comfortable stay, please follow our rules:

3.1 🏠 General

- Please treat the home with care, as if it were your own.
- Only registered guests are allowed to stay overnight.
- Quiet hours are from 10:00 PM to 7:00 AM.
- Please be mindful of neighbors and keep noise to a minimum during this time.

3.2 🎉 No Parties or Events

- Parties, events, or large gatherings are not allowed.
- Please keep noise at a respectful level at all times.

3.3 🚭 No Smoking

- Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the apartment.
- This includes cigarettes, cigars, vapes, and e-cigarettes.
- Smoking is allowed outside, please dispose of cigarette butts properly.

3.4 🐾 Pets

- Small pets only, and only with prior approval.
- Pets must be well-behaved and not left unattended.
- Guests are responsible for any damage or extra cleaning caused by pets.

3.5 🧹 Cleanliness

- Please keep the space reasonably clean.
- Dispose of trash properly before check-out.

4. Transportation

Prague offers several easy and convenient ways to get around. The city has an **excellent public transport** system with metro lines, trams, and buses that are **reliable and affordable**. **Walking** is also a great option, especially in the **historic center** where many attractions are close to each other. Taxis and ride-sharing services like **Uber** and **Bolt** are widely available, and for a more active choice, you can rent **bikes** throughout the city.

4.1 From the Airport

At Prague Airport, **Terminal 1** is used for flights **outside the Schengen Area**, while **Terminal 2** serves flights **within the Schengen Area**. The terminals are located close to each other and are easily accessible on foot. When arriving or departing, **make sure to check your terminal in advance**, as passport control procedures differ between the two.

4.2 From the Train Station

Praha Hlavní Nádraží is very close and within easy walking distance. If you prefer to walk less, you can take the metro directly from the train station and ride just one stop, which significantly shortens the walk and is quick and convenient.

- **Walking only**

- 16 minutes walk / 1.1 km

- **Metro + Walking**

- Metro Line C: Hlavní nádraží => I. P. Pavlova
- 10 minutes walk / 700 m

4.3 Public Transportation

Public transportation in Prague is **reliable, affordable, and easy to use**. The system includes metro lines, trams, and buses that cover the entire city and run frequently throughout the day.

We highly recommend the **PID Lítačka app**, which makes using public transportation in Prague much easier. The app allows you to buy tickets, plan routes, and check real-time connections for metro, trams, and buses all in one place: app.pidlitacka.cz

4.4 Taxis in Prague

Taking a taxi in Prague is quite **comfortable and convenient**, offering door-to-door service. Popular options include traditional taxis as well as apps like **Bolt and Uber**, which provide easy booking and transparent pricing. However, traffic can be heavy, especially during rush hours or in the city center, so travel times may be longer than expected.

4.5 Travelling by Car

Just like any metropolis, Prague is struggling with an increase in the number of cars on the road and a **lack of parking spaces**. That is why going by car is only recommended if you travel long distances or outside the city.

It is advisable to make use of **P+R car parks** where you can leave your car for the whole day for a good price. Some P+R car parks are located directly at terminal metro stations, others can be found in key places convenient for drivers. 4.6 Rent a Bike

Prague has several **bike-sharing** options, such as [Rekola](https://rekola.com) and [Nextbike](https://nextbike.com), which allow you to pick up and drop off bikes at multiple locations across the city. Keep in mind, however, that Prague is quite **hilly** in some areas, and the cycling **infrastructure isn't as developed as in other European cities**, so it's best to plan your route carefully and be prepared for some uphill rides.

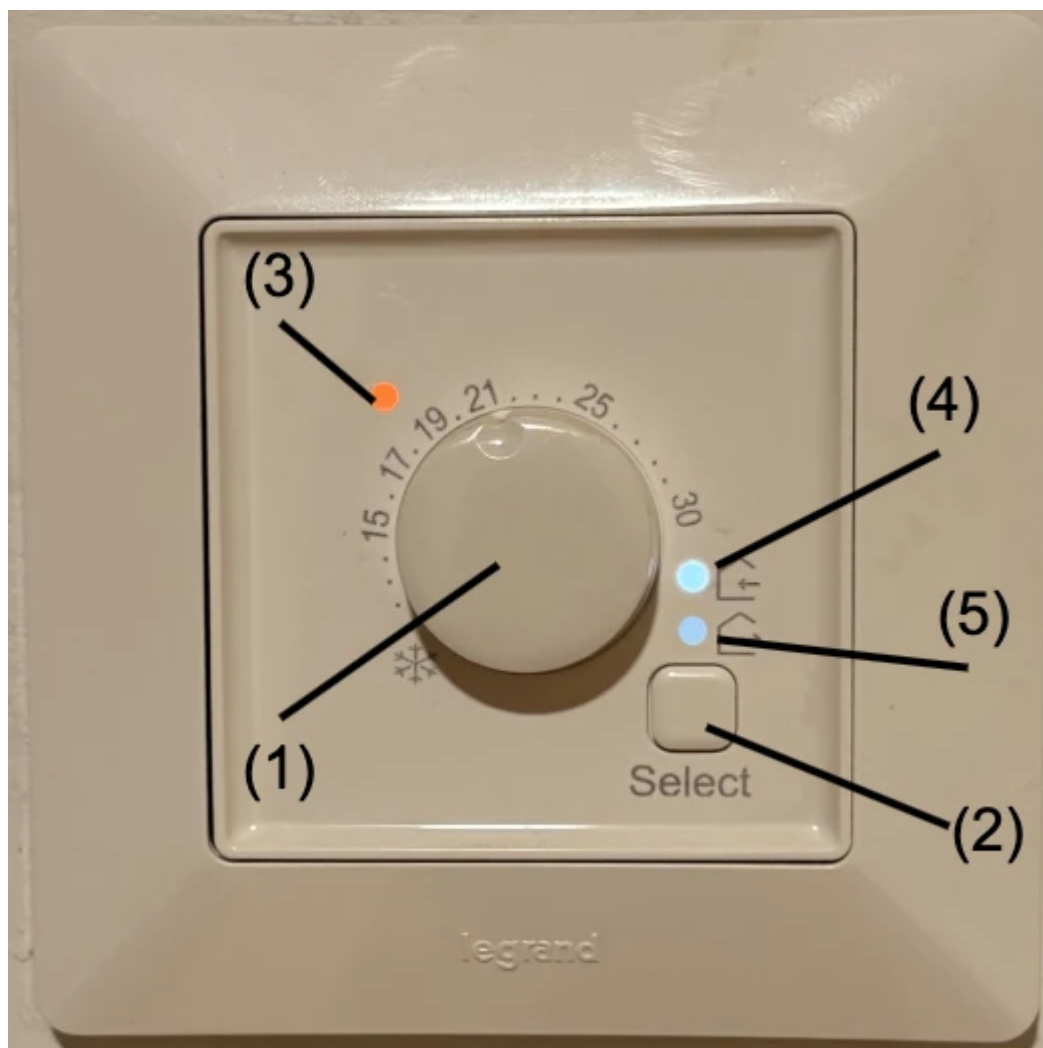

5.2 Heating

There are two thermostats in the apartment. One next to the TV in the living room, one in the bathroom.

- **Set temperature:** Use knob (1) to adjust the temperature.
- **Heating indicator:** (3) lights orange when actively heating, white when the set temperature is reached and maintained.
- **Heating on/off indicators:** (4) white when heating is on, (5) white when heating is off. Use the switch (2) to turn heating on/off.



6. Money

In Prague, you can use **credit cards in most places**, from restaurants and shops to attractions, making it very convenient for travelers. However, there are a few exceptions, particularly some smaller pubs, where only cash is accepted. If you need to exchange cash, it's important to familiarize yourself with how Czech koruna (CZK) banknotes look and only use **verified exchange offices**. **Avoid exchanging money in public or with strangers on the street**, as this can be risky.
